Residents, members of the Farncombe Initiative and the Mayor of Godalming, Councillor David Hunter, gathered together recently to see a new bench that has been installed in Marshall Road (junction of Lower Manor Road) as part of the work of the Farncombe Initiative.

David Hunter Mayor of Godalming said “I was thrilled to see such a simple improvement bringing benefit to a wide range of the community, particularly young families. The Farncombe Initiative goes from strength to strength and serves the community well.”

The Farncombe Initiative is a community-led project making improvements to the local environment and reflecting the village’s strong sense of community. Other improvement work undertaken includes the installation of new litter bins, a new Farncombe village sign, bulb & shrub planting schemes and litter picking days. Further improvements are in the pipeline and all local residents and businesses are urged to get involved or attend the regular meetings.
