Throughout the day visitors enjoyed a packed programme of entertainment at The Pepperpot that included Moss Lane School's superb Christmas songs, teenage band The Unwanted from Milford-based The Music Works, The Godalming Rock Choir, The Nefarious Picaroons and soloist Emilee Lucia. The day ended with the Godalming Band playing in the lead up to the switching on of Godalming's beautiful Christmas lights by Wishee Washee and Princess Jasmine from the Yvonne Arnaud's Panto Aladdin, along with Godalming Town Mayor, Cllr David Hunter, ably assisted by heroic pups Chase and Skye from PAW Patrol and all brilliantly compered by Simon Rose of Eagle Radio.

In addition to the atmospheric icicle lights that enhance the town centre buildings, Godalming Town Council is delighted to have added sparkling Antari stars and new Christmas trees in the High Street along with Christmas lanterns in Bridge Street.
