# Godalming Cycle Campaign

At the Full Council meeting of 17 September (Min No 174-20 refers) delegated authority was provided for the Environment & Planning Committee to consider and, if appropriate, approve, options brought forward relating to Christmas in Godalming during COVID-19, including budgetary issues.

In light of the current guidelines, the option for a Christmas Festival Market to be held on the Bury's Field has not been pursued. Members are requested to consider the proposals and accompanying PR plan brought forward by the Community & Communications Officer (attached for the information for Members), which are considered to be in keeping with current guidelines.

If Members are minded to approve the expenditure contained in proposals, it is suggested the funding is drawn from the Christmas Lights reserve which currently stands at £8,788.

# 8. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENTS – BURYS ALLOTMENTS – ITEM FOR NOTE

Members are requested to note the environmental improvement works undertaken by GTC staff at The Bury's Allotments. Significant amounts (approx 30 cubic yards) of non-organic waste has been removed from the site, mainly consisting of hard and soft plastics (including tens of dozens of empty plastic bags which had previously held compost and weed control chemical containers), household sanitary ware, and many other items that either should never have been brought onto the allotment site or should have been removed when no longer required. It is hoped that the current tenants will not repeat the mistakes of the past and remove the packaging of anything they bring on the site to use on their allotment plot. The cleared areas now not only provide greater opportunities for cultivation, but will allow for the provision of safer wildlife areas around the boundary of the allotment site.

# CARBON REDUCTION & BIODIVERSITY FUND GUIDANCE NOTES AND APPLICATION FORM

# **GUIDANCE NOTES FOR APPLICANTS**

## Aim of the fund

Godalming Town Council established a Carbon Reduction & Biodiversity Fund in July 2019 in order to provide funding towards projects where a primary aim is to reduce CO2 emissions from households, organisations or individuals in Godalming and promote biodiversity. The fund is designed to support activities such as (but not limited to); practical work, feasibility studies/research projects, awareness raising or training.

The Council anticipates that projects which fit into one or more of the following themes to be eligible for this grant, though innovative schemes which further the aims of this grant, but do not fit within these categories are also welcome to apply.

- Energy conservation and renewable energy,
- Reduction in energy use in homes, businesses and elsewhere,
- Low carbon transport,
- Farming and food, particularly the production, sale and consumption of preferably organic locally sourced food
- Community involvement in reducing CO2 emissions
- The creation, restoration or enhancement of wildlife habitats

The **primary criterion** for carbon reduction applications to the fund is **CO2 savings per pound spent**. The carbon reduction grants are intended to help facilitate projects whose primary aim is to reduce CO<sup>2</sup> emissions within Godalming parish. Although not required, applications who are able to provide a quantitative estimate of CO<sup>2</sup> savings that result from their proposed activity will be favoured.

The **primary criterion** for biodiversity applications to the fund is **biodiversity net gain**.

The fund can endorse projects which enable applicants to leverage income from other sources or be the full and only sponsor of the project.

# Funding priorities

In addition to the primary aim of the fund, applications will be at an advantage if the project fulfils one or more of the following criteria:

- Is innovative in its approach to the reduction of CO<sup>2</sup>
- Develops a stronger and more sustainable community
- Encourages community engagement around sustainability and reduction of CO<sup>2</sup>

- Improve the overall biodiversity of habitats including woodlands, ponds, rivers, meadows, green spaces and the wider countryside in the Godalming parish.
- Demonstrate additionality, specifically a net gain in biodiversity will be been achieved using the grant funding that would not otherwise have been achieved.
- Secure a site as a biodiversity asset in perpetuity

# How to use these guidance notes

These guidance notes accompany the grant application form and are provided to help you make the best possible case for an award from the fund. To make best use of the guidance notes, follow the steps below:

**FIRST** – check that your project meets the fund conditions. If it does not, you will not receive funding.

**SECOND** – if your project meets the conditions, it is important that you make this clear on the application form. Make sure that your answer to the question indicated after each condition clearly demonstrates that you meet that condition.

**THIRD** – the more of our **funding priorities** that your project fulfils, the better chance you have of receiving a grant. When filling in the form, be clear as to which of the funding priorities your project relates and how it does so. The questions where you can do this most easily are indicated after each funding priority below; you may find other opportunities. You do not have to address all the priorities, you could still be funded even if your project does not address them as long as it addresses the main **aim** of the fund (as above).

## **FUND CONDITIONS**

Funding will be awarded *only* if:

- There has been no successful application to Godalming Town Council for funding for the same project in the previous twelve months (Q7)
- The project is designed primarily to focus on the reduction of **CO2** in Godalming, ultimately for the benefit of the global community but also for the residents of the parish **(Q10, Q17)**
- The project does not financially benefit any private individual or private company (for example, the fund could not be used to fund solar panels on roof of an applicants private residence).

# Additional extras

It would also be beneficial to provide the following information to assist the Council with its decision making.

- List potential beneficial effects that extend beyond the period of the project itself
- Where the project is likely to be long-term or open-ended, the application includes a projection of how it will be funded after any grant awarded by the Town Council is spent.

The vision is to provide a route that a wide variety of users could comfortably share including pedestrians, cyclists, wheelchair and buggy users, and parents wheeling pushchairs.  The existing footpath from the Library to the junction with Borough Road measures approximately 700m using Waverley's onsite display map. This assumes the route will use the footpath that runs parallel to the Library car park rather than the longer path that follows the river. The width currently varies and would need to widened in places, so that it is no less than 3m wide. Where the route cannot be widened, (behind the Godalming and Farncombe Bowles Club) signage such as 'Share with Care' or 'Give Way to Pedestrians', would need to be put up.  The study would be commissioned by Waverley and adhere to the Department of Transport 'Cycle Infrastructure Design' July 2020 document, ensuring proper construction and that the route is safe and attractive to all users.

The widened path (called Greenway) will facilitate access for cyclists and residents in general to public transports (e.g. train stations) without having to use motor vehicles. It will also create a link for residents to reach places of interest like the town center and the river path to Guildford. With the existence of such an infrastructure the community will feel more encouraged to turn to active travel rather than using motor vehicles to reach different locations.



# Proposed route through the Phillips Memorial Park



The proposed route follows the River-side path and New Way

This is the quietest route for the intended audience. It is scenic and is likely to be cheaper and easier than the other routes to bring up to standard. It also provides a good link to the rail station.

The High Street was seriously considered as an attractive alternative. Taking the route through the town would offer direct access to key services and destinations providing a closer connection with the many cafes, restaurants and shops in the town. This would be of clear benefit to greenway users and bring a business advantage to traders. Unfortunately, the option is not currently available due to the one-way restrictions which prohibit twoway use by people on bikes. (The regulations could, of course be changed. In February 2001, the inspector conducting the Local Public Inquiry into proposed changes to the Traffic Regulation Order for Godalming Town Centre [1] noted that two-way cycling through the high street would be "entirely consistent with County and national policy" and recommended "an extended trial ... in order to evaluate it".) The town centre route is slightly shorter than the River-side path/New Way option (1.44 kms compared with 1.72 kms.)

If the recommended route is accepted, a link or links to enable greenway users to access the town centre would be required.

Flambard Way was not designed with cycling or pedestrians in mind and would require significant investment to create a route suitable for family use. Similarly, Ockford Road is busy and space is tight. By sacrificing parking, it may be possible to create a roadside greenway but New Way presents itself as the preferred option.

Five options have been considered for this section:

- River-side path/New Way
- The Burys/New Way
- Godalming High Street/New Way
- Godalming High Street/Ockford Road
- Flambard Way/Ockford Road

# Covering letter for Carbon Reduction and Biodiversity Fund

This grant application is being submitted by Godalming Cycling Campaign so that Waverley can use it to commission the design and feasibility study which would complete the section of the Greenway in the Philips Memorial Park.

Godalming Cycling Campaign is a voluntary organisation which does not have a constitution, it has only twenty volunteers. However it is an inclusive body and does not discriminate. Some questions (21-24) on the application form relate to policy and therefore cannot be answered.

Dear Sirs,

Re Application to the Carbon Reduction and Biodiversity Fund (CRBF) by Godalming Cycle Campaign on behalf of Waverley Borough Council.

I am writing on behalf of the Godalming Cycle Campaign (GCC) in relation to the application to the Town Council's CRBF for a grant to Waverley Borough Council to cover the cost of a feasibility and design study (FDS) of the Philips Memorial Park section of the Guildford Godalming Greenway (The Greenway)

The Greenway is a fully off road cycle and pedestrian path principally linking Guildford and Godalming High Streets with extensions to Farncombe and Binscombe and onto Milford. It is open to all non motorised traffic including cyclists and walkers as well as joggers, disabled scooters, children on scooters, parents with prams, dog walkers etc.

Full details of the Greenway can be found at our website guildfordgodalminggreenway.com

This application to the CRBF is for £3,000 to cover the cost of a feasibility and design study which will principally give an accurate estimate of the cost of building this section of the Greenway as well as architect quality building plans which can be used to instruct the company building the path.

We have recommended to Waverley they instruct a company called Transport Initiatives (TI) to write the report as they are comparatively local being based in Brighton and have recently written a substantial report

on cycle paths for Guildford Borough Council. also, one of their consultants lives in Godalming and we are hopeful he will be commissioned to write the report.

We have obtained an estimate from TI of £2,000 for the cost of the report and have applied on behalf of Waverley for a grant of £3,000 to give a financial cushion however under the CRBF rules, Waverley will only be allowed to spend any grant from the CRBF on the study so that should the actual cost be less than £3,000 the surplus will be returned to the Town Council.

Once Waverley have received the FDS it intends to apply to its own CIL management board for funding to build this section of the Greenway. Applications for this funding have to be submitted by 31 January 2021. We have estimated the cost of widening the existing footpath by one metre along the 700 metre section along the river in the park to be in the region of £64,000.

There is an existing footpath in the Philips Memorial Park which broadly follows the River Wey and covers the route of the Greenway. Part of this path is already 3 metres wide and needs only signage to convert it to the Greenway standard and the remaining 700 metres require the path to be widened by 1 metre.

The Godalming Cycle Campaign have received undertakings from Surrey County Council that on the building of the Ockford Park development in Ockford Ridge, the council will ensure that they will build the section of the Greenway from Ockford Park and therefore the whole of Ockford Ridge along New Way/ Westbrook Road/ Station Road to Godalming High Street by the Red Lion pub. Therefore once this is completed, with the exception of a short section of footpath along Vicarage Walk, Godalming residents will be able to cycle and walk in complete safety from Ockford Ridge/ Aaron's Hill ( where car ownership is the lowest in Godalming) to Godalming Library, Waitrose Supermarket and the council offices at The Burys.

At the Guildford end of the Greenway the section through Shalford Park is already complete and the section from there to Shalford village is advanced with a design study completed and we understand finances available to build the same.

In relation to the CRB application form - the Godalming Cycle Campaign is a legally unincorporated body, and therefore it has no formal legal status and is unable itself to apply for a grant and for this reason the grant is being made on behalf of Waverley Borough Council who have approved the same, will received any funds granted and be accountable for the same to the Town Council.

I hope this letter will be helpful to the Town Councillors in their consideration of the application.

I would be happy to answer any questions councillors have either prior to the meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> October or at the meeting which I plan to attend via Zoom.

Retailers'/businesses' logo to be added, date of offer and offer.

#Godalming Christmas including Christmas Crackers Countdown to be publicised from 1 November via GTC social media platforms, GTC website, Godalming & District Chamber of Commerce website, participating shops/businesses' websites and media distribution.
