Wilfrid Noyce Centre - Godalming Town Council recently completely renovated and refurbished the Wilfrid Noyce Centre at a cost of £1,056,438. It was reopened on 12 March 2016.

Godalming Choral Society - The choir was established originally in 1856 and reformed in 1967. Michael Veazey, who took up the baton in 2007, is only its third conductor since then. His orchestra of picked young players, the Eroica, usually plays alongside the choir. The choir's president is Jonathan Veira, the international opera singer who takes an active interest and appears at rehearsals and singing days.

The choir has about 70 singers and performs works across the choral repertoire from oratorio to part songs, with plenty of modern music too. Recently the choir sang Richard Blackford's 'Mirror of Perfection', the composer applauding in the audience.

The choir is welcoming new singers with some experience to all voice parts.
