A packed programme of entertainment at The Pepperpot began with an enchanting performance by children from Moss Lane Infant School singing Christmas songs. Sterling performances continued with the Godalming Rock Choir, Emilee Lucia and Claudia Stark. Ed and Harry Forbes from Changing Colour were in fine form and the Godalming Bulgarian Dancers in their colourful national dress gave an energetic performance for the crowd.

Godalming Museum played host to the town's special guest Paddington™ and children enjoyed riding Dexter and Merla the Christmas Ponies in Church Street.

The Santa's Grotto at the Wilfrid Noyce Centre was once again organised and run by The Godalming & District Chamber of Commerce, ably assisted by the Witley Panto Company. Godalming Junior School's tea and cake concession and Busbridge Infant School's crafts and activities on the go kept the little ones entertained whilst waiting to see Father Christmas.

The Godalming Band played for the crowd in the countdown to the lights switch-on and the dazzling icicle lights were lit up in a sparkling ceremony helped by the Town Council's special guest Paddington™, Eagle Radio DJ Simon Rose, Father Christmas and the Yvonne Arnaud's Cinderella Panto Stars, Georgie Leatherhead (Cinderella) and Cameron Burt (Prince Charming).
