## 8. MOTION ON NOTICE – ITEM FOR DECISION

### **Proposed by Cllr Follows.**

**Recommendation: Members to consider the Motion and if agreed, resolve to approve the implementation of the motion as set out in the motion.**

**The Motion:** Godalming Town Council wishes Surrey County Council to consult on the implementation of Road Traffic Orders that would have the effect of:

1. Creating a 20mph zone within the Godalming Primary Shopping area as defined in Waverley Local Plan Part 2 and the Godalming & Farncombe Neighbourhood Plan that would:
  - a) Create a safe environment for both pedestrians and vehicle drivers within the Godalming Primary Shopping Area.
  - b) Create a safer environment on the approach to the prohibited traffic area on Godalming High Street located west of its junction with Pound Lane to its junction with Church Street by managing traffic speeds thereby enabling greater opportunity of understanding of the approaching restricted area and the diversion route for non-permitted traffic.
  - c) Be identified by the installation of 20mph speed zone area signs at Wharf Street at its junction with Flambard Way, Church Street at its junction with Station Road, The Bury at its junction with Bridge Street.
2. Creating a Prohibition of Entry, High Street, Godalming from its junction with Pound Lane to its junction with Church Street 10.00am to 4.00pm, except for buses, taxis and loading and unloading by goods vehicles or access only to Harts Yard or Moss Lane.
3. Creating designated loading and unloading bay(s) and Blue badge holder disabled bays within Godalming town centre.
4. Allowing for contra-flow cycling along the length of Godalming High Street and the provision of appropriate information signage.
5. Allowing for contra-flow cycling along the length of Bridge Street and the provision of appropriate signage.
6. Allowing for contra-flow cycling along the length of Church Street and the provision of appropriate signage.
7. The painting of double yellow lines with provision for loading by way of kerb marking yellow lines on the south side of Godalming High Street between its junction with Wharf Street and Queen Street.
8. The painting of double yellow lines with provision for loading by way of kerb markings in the layby on the north side of High Street outside No 6.

**Action:** If the Motion is carried The Town Clerk to write to the Cllr Furniss, Surrey County Council Cabinet Member for Transport & Infrastructure and to the SCC Partnership Committee Officer for the SCC Waverley Local Committee for SCC to consider GTC's request.

## 4. Main Activities of Organisation

**What Next's Charitable Purpose:** to promote the conservation, protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment in the Borough of Waverley for the public benefit of its residents and the wider community by raising awareness and providing information on climate and ecological issues, working collaboratively with other environmental groups, and educating the public, local business and other local bodies on the impact and mitigation of, as well as adaptation to, climate and ecological changes.

- Disseminating examples of local good practice concerning sustainability, promoting biodiversity and reducing waste.
- Facilitating climate coaching and listening opportunities to support people who are anxious about the climate and ecological emergency.
- Bringing together local climate and ecology concerned groups to support each other's projects by building and maintaining a network of concerned groups.
- Developing strong links and working directly with local government.
- Supporting and promoting local, national and global campaigns which advocate actions that might be taken to mitigate and adapt to climate and ecological changes.
- We are particularly aware of the need to engage young people (not children) and those individuals who are less likely to engage in activities related to the environment (for whatever reasons). Consequently, we intend to organise events with such groups in mind.

## 8. Organisation known to Council

We are known to Godalming Borough Council.

We have worked with Godalming Town Council on the **Take the Jump Event** (3<sup>rd</sup> July, 2021), assisted by Andy Jeffreys. We helped host the **Godalming Green Gala** with Suzie Gortler. (14<sup>th</sup> August, 2021).

We have also worked with Waverley Borough Council, delivering **Climate Action Workshops** to students from Broadwater School and Godalming College during COP26 (1<sup>st</sup> November 2021).

## 9. Description of Project

The project has identified our diet as a significant way to help live sustainably. We plan to offer knowledge, information and practical help to local people wishing to understand the carbon footprint of the food they eat and move toward a diet that has a low carbon footprint.

Our venue has excellent natural light and a catering kitchen; we would like to use this for the benefit of the community and the climate. Our volunteers will be there, in the centre of Godalming to help people grow and cook sustainably. We would like to demonstrate how a sustainable diet can be delicious and nutritious.

We grow edible plants in the venue to share and cook. We will regularly provide free food to the people of Godalming.

For example, we will provide workshops, support, information and tastings related to:

- A fair sustainable diet (Eat Lancet Report, see section 11)
- Making the link between the right diet, health and sustainability
- Making changes step by step
- Reducing waste
- Carbon friendly cooking
- Buying food with least environmental impact
- Growing food sustainably
- Growing food indoors and in small spaces

We will bring together organisations such as The Rotary Association, The Godalming Climate Forum, The Allotment Association, Compassion in World Farming, sustainable food providers and climate friendly pop-up restaurants. We wish to share knowledge and resources with these groups and avoid duplication of effort. We wish to create a knowledgeable and supportive low carbon food community.

## 10. CO<sub>2</sub> Reduction

UK wide, food and diet typically contribute between 20% and 25% of a typical individual's carbon footprint. Data from the **IMPACT Community Carbon Calculator** (<https://impact-tool.org.uk/>) gives the **UK Average Consumption** greenhouse gas emissions as 15.8 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e /household/yr, of which 3.6 (or 23%) are directly related to food / diet.

**Godalming** is consistent with this, with average consumption emissions of 18.7 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e /household/yr, of which 4.3 (or 23%) are directly related to food / diet. Similarly, for **Waverley Borough** as a whole, average consumption emissions are 20.3 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e /household/yr, of which 4.3 (or 21%) are directly related to food / diet.

It is clear that food and diet make a significant contribution to each individual's carbon footprint and therefore the overall carbon footprint of a community. It is also an area where there is significant scope for most individuals to make changes to reduce their carbon footprint. This can be achieved in numerous ways: exchanging high production emissions food for lower emissions food (meat to plant-based), reducing food waste, eating locally sourced food (reducing food miles), growing your own food, etc.

## 11. Quantitative Measures

The **EAT-Lancet** report [1] is a full scientific review of what constitutes a healthy diet from a sustainable food system, and which actions can support and speed up food system transformation.

It determined the average quantity of each different food group that can be consumed by each individual on a planet, in a sustainable manner given a global population of 10 billion people. Further details can be found on the Eat-Lancet Commission website [2].

Carbon emissions data for different food groups was sourced from the EAT-Lancet Report [1] and Poore *et al* (2018) [3,4]. For weight to protein ratios for different food groups we used data from Diet and Fitness Today [1].

To determine the average carbon footprint from food consumption for a typical UK citizen we have used food consumption data from the UK Government Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA), the Family Food Survey 2018/19 [6].

To determine the carbon footprint for the EAT-Lancet Diet, the mid-range values for daily quantities were used. Where meat protein was reduced, it has been assumed that it is replaced by Soya-based protein and the carbon-footprint of this soya has been accounted for.

To determine a typical Vegan diet, it was assumed that all meat and dairy products (including) eggs were removed and the protein substituted by soya and, again, the carbon-footprint of this soya has been accounted for.

Carbon emissions data for Food and Diet for Godalming are sourced from IMPACT Community Carbon Calculator [7]. Due to differences in the methodologies for determining carbon footprints between EAT Lancet [1], Poore [3,4] and IMPACT comparative-scaling has been used.

## **Carbon Footprint Reduction as Compared to the UK Average**

Carbon reduction for **EAT-Lancet**-based Diet: 0.94 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr  
*This represents a 67% reduction of carbon as compared to a UK average diet.*

If adopted for one-day per week, a reduction of: 134 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr  
*This represents a 10% reduction of carbon as compared to a UK average diet.*

If adopted for four-days per week, a reduction of: 537 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr  
*This represents a 38% reduction of carbon as compared to a UK average diet.*

Carbon reduction for a typical **Vegan** Diet: 1.2 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr  
*This represents a 86% reduction of carbon as compared to a UK average diet.*

If adopted for one-day per week, a reduction of: 171 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr  
*This represents a 12% reduction of carbon as compared to a UK average diet.*

If adopted for four-days per week, a reduction of: 686 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr  
*This represents a 49% reduction of carbon as compared to a UK average diet.*



## **Carbon Footprint Reduction as Compared to Godalming Average**

Carbon reduction for an **EAT-Lancet**-based Diet: 1.44 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr

*This represents a 76% reduction of carbon as compared to the Godalming Average.*

If adopted for one-day per week, a reduction of: 206 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr

*This represents a 11% reduction of carbon as compared to the Godalming Average.*

If adopted for four-days per week, a reduction of: 823 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr

*This represents a 43% reduction of carbon as compared to the Godalming Average.*

Carbon reduction for a typical **Vegan** Diet: 1.7 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr

*This represents an 89% reduction of carbon as compared to the Godalming Average.*

If adopted for one-day per week, a reduction of: 243 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr

*This represents an 13% reduction of carbon as compared to the Godalming Average.*

If adopted for four-days per week, a reduction of: 971 kg CO<sub>2</sub>e/pp/yr

*This represents an 51% reduction of carbon as compared to the Godalming Average.*

## **12. Additional Benefits**

We would hope to see the benefits of a community forming through eating together, leading to anticipated mental health and general well-being benefits, such as a reduction in loneliness and anxiety. Research conducted by Dr. Dunbar from the University of Oxford reviews the benefits of social eating. In his paper, Dunbar shows: *“that those who eat socially more often feel happier and are more satisfied with life, are more trusting of others, are more engaged with their local communities, and have more friends they can depend on for support.”* [8,9]

The physical health benefits, which might be anticipated from eating a more varied diet with increased quantities of fruit, vegetables and nuts, and reduced quantities of meat and dairy products, are directly considered in the EAT-Lancet Report [1].

Furthermore, it is anticipated, that additional physical and mental health benefits will result from participants engaging in the physical activity of gardening and through exposure to the outdoors / nature in the growing part of the project.

Finally, the refurbished kitchen facility could be made available to community cooks who would like to trial and share environmentally friendly recipes, run pop-up events and community engagement activities.

- Long term the reduction in carbon will support Godalming and beyond in bringing the CO<sub>2</sub> numbers down.

## 18. Measures of Success

Numbers of people who use our offers to learn and apply their knowledge. Every climate friendly meal counts.

We will record how many participants are able to grow food in or near their homes and how many people switch to sustainable growing.

When people begin to make changes, they tend to share their knowledge and influence others. We will gather ongoing stories of how people are influencing each other. Based on Denise Baden's impact study" [10]

## **19. Start and Finish**

Starting in Spring 2022 and will be an ongoing project. In the medium-term, we plan to support this project partly through general donations when the public visit our centre for our events and activities: our Climate Club, Eco-theatre, Eco-tainment evenings for example.

Furthermore, although we are planning to make a large proportion of the food / seeds / other products available to the public free of charge, we also anticipate raising money through donations from individuals when sharing the outputs of this project.
